"Driving the forces towards A Green Agenda for Urbanized Society: A matter of Choice or Destiny?"

Thematic Session Summary

The thematic session will bring together policy and decision makers as well as international institutions involved in urban and peri-urban development. The guest speakers will present thematic and regional issues, such as those of: urban and rural planning; energy needs; land tenure; livelihoods and food needs; migration, refugees and social arrest; climate change impact and extreme weather events mitigation. The focus will be on the need to conciliate the urban to the rural, to optimize the tree and forest cover. Recent experiences will illustrate lessons learned. Strategic opportunities and tactical actions to shape plan of actions will be discussed. A mosaic of indicators and criteria to consider for building a vision, design the options and implement the measures will stimulate the debate in view of poverty alleviation and environmental sustainability.
